Part I. HISTORY OF UKRAINE

Topic 1: "Pre-princely and princely period"

Topic highlights: realization of the thought that the pre-princely



period of history is Ukrainian and that on Ukrainian lands there existed more than 35 states at different time. The most important of these states was

Aratta-Oratania (Trypillian culture),

that put the start of world civilization. Understanding the problems of the current stage incipience of the Ukrainian state based on the knowledge of the Ukrainian state of the pre-princely period. The continuity of state-creative processes from times of the ancient world till today. The Chalcolithic period was followed by a period of Bronze (from 2nd till 1st millennium BC) when the first artificial man-made alloy was created, that has great advantages over the copper. During the Bronze Age patriarchal relations (rule of men) finally gained a foothold in those times society. Approximately at the turn of the 2nd and 1st millennium BC begins early Iron Age. At this time, the development of agriculture, soldiery, craft, and trade is activated. Development of the Kyivan state. Informing data about the origin, development, and decline of the Ukrainian state after a population of Galychyna-Volynia state. Continuation of Kyivan Rus traditions; Russian chauvinistic historiography.
